4.) One course or exam may satisfy more than one requirement.

5.) Up to 90 credits may be transferred in from a 2-year institution.

6.) Credits earned through exam are counted as coming from beyond a 2-year institution.

7.) This is a 45 credit concentration. 15 credits must be at the upper division.

8.) COSC's only residency requirement is the 3-credit concentration capstone course.

9.) COSC does not accept PE activity courses in transfer.
