Minimum requirements for admission to the program in International Transportation and Trade will include attainment of the AS degree or equivalent, and the maintenance of a Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.5 or better at Herkimer County Community College. Students who complete courses as part of their AS program that are not listed on this or the previous page may apply for credit to the appropriate department at Maritime College. The Maritime College will accept up to 75 transfer credits from Herkimer County Community College.

The remainder of the BS program can be completed in four semesters at the Maritime College, plus one summer internship/work experience. Courses required for the BS degree are listed below with suggested semester.

*** A fast-track program is available for students who would like to continue at SUNY Maritime College after receiving a B.S. degree to complete an M.S. degree in International Transportation Management. The M.S. degree is offered online as well as in the classroom. Conditions for acceptance to the fast-track combined program are:

- 92 credits completed with a 3.0 grade point average
- Completion of MATH 111 (Calculus I at Herkimer) as part of the completed 92 credits

Upon acceptance, students will meet with their advisors to choose three graduate courses to substitute for three undergraduate courses. GBEC 429 and GBMG 440 are never substituted. Otherwise, three seminars from the graduate program will be chosen to substitute for three undergraduate courses. These courses will count toward both the B.S. degree and the M.S. degree.

Students completing this program of study meet the State University of New York General Education requirements. SUNY Maritime College students are exempt from the Foreign Language requirement.

This agreement will be reviewed and updat	ed at the beginning of every three years.
