COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is intended to aid the student in further developing the speaking, listening, reading and writing skills acquired in French I. The course will continue to provide information about the culture and customs of French-speaking countries.

PREREQUISITE: French I or permission of instructor.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon successful completion, the student will demonstrate the ability to:

1. conjugate more regular and irregular verbs.
2. form compound and complex declarative, interrogative, negative and imperative sentences.
3. correctly substitute direct and indirect object pronouns.
4. use correct relative pronouns.
5. form passive and active sentences
6. form present and past subjunctive tenses.
7. compare adjectives at three levels.
8. express himself orally in French at an appropriate French II college level.
9. express himself in writing.
10. the student will also demonstrate understanding of the culture of France and other French-speaking countries.

OUTCOMES

By the end of this course, the student will have demonstrated through tests, homework and various classroom activities 60% accuracy in the following French language skills:

1. conjugation of regular and irregular verbs
2. formation of compound and complex declarative, interrogative, negative and imperative sentences.
3. substitution of direct and indirect object pronouns.
4. correct use of relative pronouns
5. correct formation and use of passive and active sentences
6. correct use and formation of present and past subjunctive tenses
7. correct comparison of adjectives at three levels
8. correct oral self-expression
9. correct written self-expression

MAJOR DIVISIONS OF SUBJECT MATTER

- I. Introduction
 - A. Continuation and expansion of complex oral phrases
 - 1. Names, greetings, weather, date, time, etc.
- II. Vocabulary
 - A. Continuation of more specific topics
 - 1. Classroom, family, clothing, parts of the body, animals, transportation, house, buildings, foods, numbers & basic Math problems, professions, colors, etc.
- III. Continuation of Verbs (including reflexive topics)
 - A. Present, Past (including literary past), Immediate future and future, imperfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs
 - B. Introduction to passé simple
 - 1. Using advanced declarative, interrogative, and negative combinations.
- IV. Continuation of Grammar
 - A. Rules associated with all parts of speech on a French 2 level: nouns, pronouns, adjectives, adverbs, conjunctions, interjections, prepositions
- V. Culture & Customs of France and other French Speaking Regions--Expansion on:
 - 1. Geography, boundaries, provinces & departments
 - 2. Housing, food & drink, clothing
 - 3. Activities, sports, the workday
 - 4. Education, politics & government
 - 5. Transportation, religion
 - 6. Current Events
