COURSE DESCRIPTION

An enrichment and refinement of French III, this course provides instruction in the finer points of French grammar, as well as additional practice in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding French.

PREREQUISITE: French 223 or consent of the instructor.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

1. Conjugate all regular and irregular verbs in the present & past subjunctive mood.
2. Use correctly compound tenses, present participles, past infinitives, and conditional forms, and si clauses.
3. Use correct forms of the passive.
4. Use adjectives and adverbs correctly.
5. Use correctly all personal object, stress, and relative pronouns.
6. Use correctly all negative and indefinite forms.
7. Demonstrate understanding of a speaker of French on variety of subjects.
8. Demonstrate an appreciation and understanding of the culture of France and French-speaking countries on a variety of topics (education, geography, or customs).

 - A. Verbs followed a, and/or and other prepositions, proverbs
- V. Reading Comprehension
 - A. Various readings and texts in French for comprehension and discussion
- VI. Culture
 - A. French speaking regions (France in particular)
 - 1. history, art, literature
