Remember:

- List all the references you used at the end of your paper on a new page.
- Insert ½ inch of space between the top of the page and the Paper Title and page number.
- Insert 1 inch of space between the top of the page and the word “References”.
- The left, right, and bottom margins should be 1 inch wide.
- Double-space between lines and between references.
- If a source is longer than one line, indent the next lines one-half inch (hanging indentation).
- List references alphabetically, by author. If there is no author, use the title.
- Capitalize only the first word of titles and subtitles.
