Remember:

- ❖ This is a list of all the sources you have used. It always appears on the last page of your paper.
- ❖ Insert ½ inch of space between the top of the page and your name and page number.
- ❖ Insert 1 inch of space between the top of the page and “Works Cited.”
- ❖ The left, right, and bottom margins should be 1 inch wide.
- ❖ Double-space between lines and between sources.
- ❖ If a source is longer than one line, indent the next lines one-half inch (hanging indentation).
