

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
HERKIMER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
SUNY ONEONTA**

**COMMUNICATION ARTS: MUSIC INDUSTRY-MARKETING CONCENTRATION (AS)
AND
COMMUNICATION ARTS: MUSIC INDUSTRY-PERFORMANCE CONCENTRATION (AS)
ARTICULATED TO
MUSIC INDUSTRY (BA)**

This statement of purpose and procedures is intended to facilitate the transition of graduates of an Associate of Science program at Herkimer County Community College to a Baccalaureate degree program at SUNY Oneonta. SUNY Oneonta recognizes particular responsibility to students from its surrounding region, as well as from the rest of New York State to insure a smooth transition from a two-year institution. SUNY Oneonta has made a strong commitment to help transfer students maximize their opportunities.

AGREEMENT

1. Herkimer County Community College students who have graduated or who will graduate with an AS degree in Communication Arts: Music Industry-Marketing Concentration or with an AS degree in Communication Arts: Music Industry-Performance Concentration, who apply in a timely manner and meet the admission criteria at the time of application, will be admitted to the BA in Music Industry program at SUNY Oneonta as matriculated students with junior status.
2. There is a 66 credit limit on the number of eligible transfer credit granted from a two-year institution. If a student completes more than 66 credits as part of the AS program, the SUNY Oneonta Office of Admissions will select the 66 credits that apply best to the Bachelor's degree requirements for each student. SUNY Oneonta students must complete a minimum of 122 credits to graduate. Students transferring from Herkimer County Community College to SUNY Oneonta need to complete a minimum of 58-59 credits at SUNY Oneonta before meeting the required 122 credits to graduate. 3. Students completing the course of study put forth will complete ten of the fourteen SUNY Oneonta General Education 2 requirements (as of Fall 2013) at Herkimer County Community College.
4. The courses recommended in this agreement are not to be considered contractual; they reflect the current, appropriate sequencing of courses that will make the articulation most compatible. Students are advised to consult both the Herkimer County Community College and the SUNY Oneonta undergraduate catalogs to check any modification or changes to program requirements.

5. This agreement will be monitored by the articulation coordinators and department chairpersons. Each institution assumes responsibility for making this a viable and workable agreement for interested students, and to alert the other institutions when changes to curriculum occur so that a revised agreement may be created.
6. Each institution may carry out publication and marketing of this agreement. This can include, but is not limited to, printed material, websites, and inclusion in admissions material.
7. The following page contains course suggestions for students at Herkimer County Community College who wish to transfer to SUNY Oneonta and complete a Bachelor's degree in Music Industry. The courses can be completed in any order, as advised by faculty and staff at Herkimer County Community College.

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

All students transferring from Herkimer County Community College to SUNY Oneonta under this agreement must:

- Be in good academic standing with Herkimer County Community College.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average (cum GPA) of 2.5 at time of admission.
- Have a minimum cumulative grade point average (cum GPA) of 2.0 at time of matriculation to SUNY Oneonta.
- Have followed the appropriate and timely application process in applying to SUNY Oneonta and must furnish a final transcript with their degree posted (if a degree is earned).

Exceptions may be made on a case-by-case basis.

Once accepted to SUNY Oneonta, students transferring into the BA Music Industry program with an AS in Communication Arts: Music Industry-Marketing Concentration or an AS in Communication Arts: Music Industry-Performance Concentration will:

- Be awarded a maximum of 66 transfer credits.
- Be advised by their respective academic department as they pursue the successful completion of degree requirements.
- Be provided a degree audit outlining coursework to be completed at SUNY Oneonta to earn a BA in Music Industry.
- Qualified students will be considered for all transfer scholarships available through the Office of Admissions without filing any additional paperwork.

CONCLUSION

This agreement will come into effect on March 1, 2014 and both colleges will review and re-sign this agreement when any curriculum changes occur at either institution. The course selection included in this articulation may be subject to change as new requirements are established within the degree plans. Both institutions assume a good faith effort to continually update each college on any changes to programs and requirements. This is a joint effort on the part of both institutions to help transfer students maximize their transferability.
