

### TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Utica College

**Education Program** 

and

Herkimer College

Liberal Arts & Sciences Education Programs

May 2019

Utica College and Herkimer College, in recognition of a mutual respect for the integrity of parallel academic programs and in an effort to better serve students intending to pursue the completion of a bachelors degree, hereby enter into an agreement of an articulated program.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- 1. To encourage the transfer of qualified students from Herkimer College (HCCC) to Utica College (UC).
- 2. To award academic credit for courses completed at HCCC, that meet the terms of the Associate Degree: >Liberal Arts & Sciences: Early Childhood or Childhood Education program for application toward the requirements for the Early Childhood (Birth-Grade 2)
  - >Liberal Arts & Sciences: Childhood Education program for application toward the requirements for the Childhood Education program (Birth-Grade 2) at UC.
  - >Liberal Arts & Sciences: Childhood Education program for application toward the requirements for the Childhood Education program (Grade 1 to Grade 6) at UC.
  - To provide effective and concise guidelines for students seeking to transfer to UC. Students will have accurate and clear information regarding the transfer of their coursework and credits toward the Bachelor of Arts degree at UC.

#### TERMS OF THE TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT:

- 1. UC guarantees the acceptance of students who completed the Associate in Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences program at HCCC with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or better to UC.
- 2. UC guarantees the transfer of credit as stipulated in the attached Program of Studies. This agreement assumes the completion of the Associate Degree and completion of the courses listed on the attached Program (s) of Studies. UC requires that the last 30 credit hours granted toward the Bachelor degree must be earned in residence, with matriculated status. Additionally, the Bachelor of Arts degree requires that a <u>minimum of 90 of the 120 credits must be in the liberal arts</u> while the Bachelor of Science requires a <u>minimum of 60 of the 120 credits must be in the liberal arts</u>.
  - Students earning an Early Childhood Education, A.A.S. and pursuing the **early childhood education** program must major in a psychology-child life.
  - Students earning a Childhood Education A.S. and pursuing the **early childhood and/or childhood** program must major in a liberal arts field. At Utica College, the following liberal arts majors are available: biology, chemistry, communication arts, economics, government and politics, English, history, international studies, liberal studies, mathematics, philosophy, physics, psychology, psychology-child life, and sociology and anthropology.
  - In addition to the requirements of the major and courses for the childhood program, students must fulfill the following requirements (some of which may be satisfied by this articulation agreement):

>one year of college-level study in a language other than English and at least 6 credits *each* in English, Mathematics, Science and History.

>Students must complete and appropriately document a minimum of 100 hours of fieldwork in a school setting with at least 50 of those hours in high-needs schools.

HCCC transfer Students will be subject to all general education requirements of UC as set forth in the UC catalogue.

- Transfer students with a completed Associates Degree will be exempt from Components I & II of UC's Core Requirements.
- Students who transfer 30 credits of liberal arts and sciences (with at least 2 courses in each of UC's three categories of Component II Core—including one lab science course) will be exempt from Component II Core.
- Transfer Students who enter UC with Components I & II complete will be required to complete 3 credits of Component III: Integrated Writing.

- 4. This document is based upon the evaluation of course descriptions presented to UC. Courses listed in this agreement will transfer to UC provided a grade of "C" or better has been earned. Credit will be granted according to the appended list of equivalent courses or as general elective credit.
- 5. This Agreement shall remain in effect for a period of two years from the date listed below, with the provision that the terms specified herein will continue to apply to the students admitted from HCCC's Associate in Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences: Childhood Education and HCCC's Associate in Applied Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences: Early Childhood Education within one year of the expiration of the agreement. Students admitted to the HCCC's Associate in Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences: Childhood Education program prior to such notification shall be admitted to UC on the basis of this agreement.

#### **BENEFITS/ADVANTAGES:**

- 1. HCCC transfer students are eligible for scholarship and financial aid in all ways the same as continuing Utica College students.
- 2. Utica College will provide housing in campus residence halls within the guidelines and practices governing availability of housing for continuing students.
- 3. HCCC transfer students are eligible to participate in internships, externships, co-ops, field placements and study abroad opportunities open to continuing Utica College students.

#### **Areas of Emphasis**

Biology majors, with their advisers, can tailor the curriculum to help prepare themselves for their future goals, for example:

Pre-professional and Academic: This emphasis should satisfy the needs of students intending to apply to professional or graduate schools and should include Organic Chemistry (CHE 331 and CHE 332), Calculus (MAT 201), and two semesters of a foreign language.

Educational: This concentration encourages those students intending to be secondary or elementary school teachers to meet state certification requirements in areas in addition to biology (i.e. earth science and general science). Students take education and science courses in areas where certification is desired.

General: This emphasis adds flexibility through sampling courses outside the field of biology. Students take six hours of non-biological science courses.
